# 4. Ordinance 11-2019 (PUBLIC HEARING)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY CODE, ARTICLE IV, DIVISION 6, SECTION 74-206 PROVIDING FOR SUBDIVISION SIGNS IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO SUCH SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, CODIFICATION AND CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- a. Commissioner Bassinger asked if the ordinance had requirements for approved monument signs.
- b. Pam Pepperman of Palm Street asked about provisions for maintenance of the signs. Conditions for maintenance would be implemented by the Central Florida Regional Council when amending the City's full sign code. Maintenance issues would be addressed by the City's code enforcement official.

# B. PARKS AND RECREATION - COMMISSIONER BASSINGER (00:29:40):

- 1. The opening of the dog park was pushed back to February to allow staff to address the water in the park, and to install a bench and other amenities.
- 2. The reroof of the depot was completed.
- 3. Commissioner Bassinger discussed conditions of approval for an event in City Park. The commission discussed the possibility of collecting deposits for events not sponsored by a 501(c)3. Rules banning smoking and vaping in the park were also discussed.

# C. STREETS - CITY CLERK RICHARD ALLEY (00:43:31):

- 1. A survey of Pompanic Street would be done to evaluate an area for a drainage easement. A finalized bid packet was anticipated in January.
- 2. The sidewalk repair and asphalt paving on Saint Anthony Way was completed.
- 3. The paving project on Pennsylvania Avenue would not be scheduled until the leak in front of the fire station was addressed. The leak was able to be isolated, but quotes for the repair had not been received.

### D. WATERWORKS - COMMISSIONER STALLWORTH (00:50:36):
